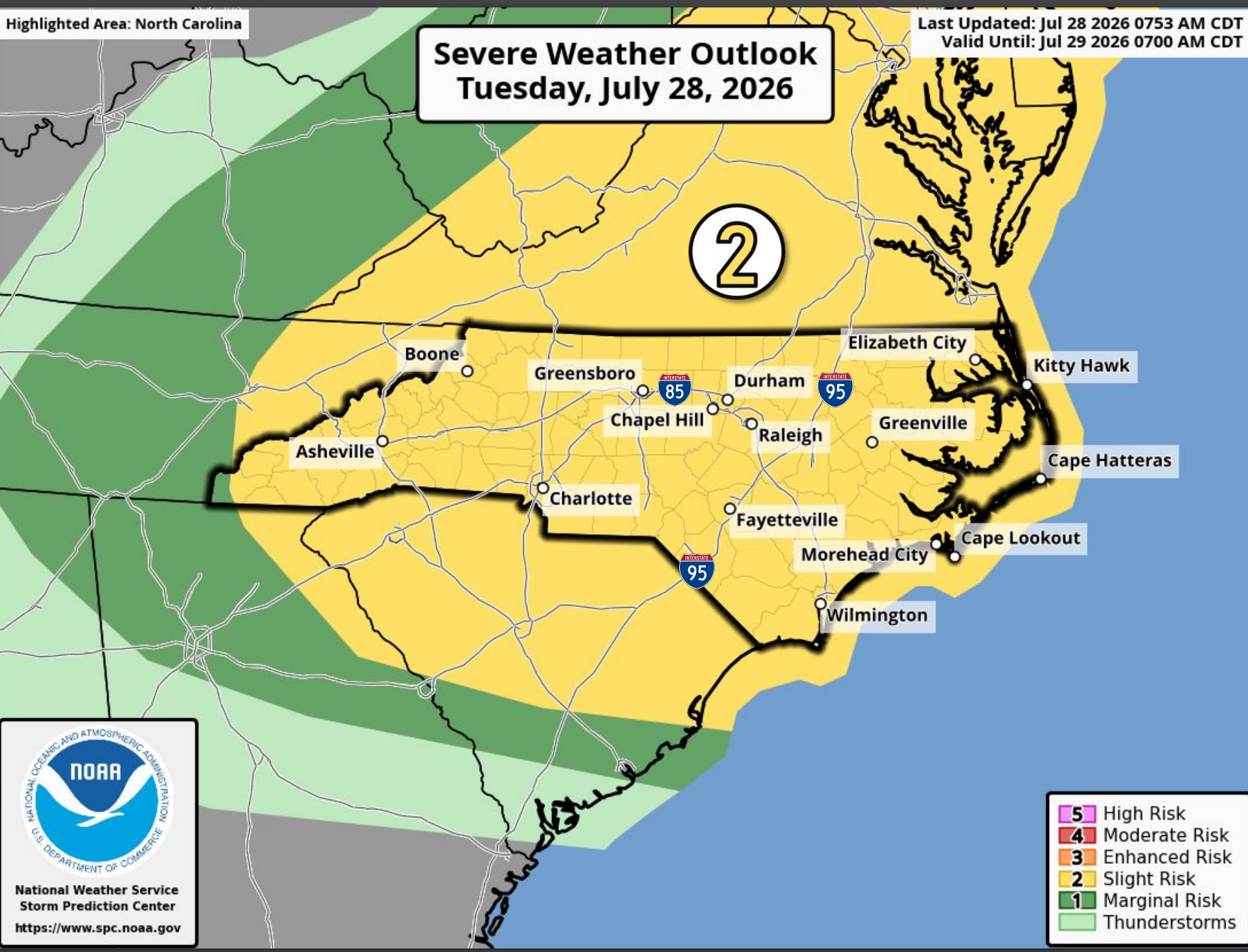

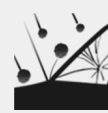

- Second round** of scattered storms, some strong to severe, is expected to move through the region late this afternoon through evening hours: **mainly between 4pm and 10pm**.

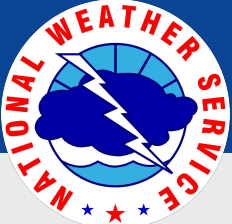
